### Precinct 205 Election Summary

2830 voters voted in the 2010 General Election. This was 58% of our registered voters! This compared to 47% county-wide and 37% state-wide. Once again Precinct 205 exceeded all expectations! We had 1799 early voters, 977 voters on election day and 54 mail-in ballots. In the Governor's race, Perry had 2165 or 78% of the vote. White had 541, or 19% of the vote. "Others" had 89, or 3% of the vote. Other races generally followed those percentages. Thanks to everyone who took the time to vote. ### QUARRY COMMISSION HAPPENINGS

The Garden Ridge Quarry Commission held its monthly meeting on November 8, 2010. There was no meeting in October since the meeting date fell on a city holiday (Columbus Day) and city offices were closed. Citizens expressed concerns about the unusual blast during the month. There were 5 blasts in September and 5 in October. Hanson, Vibra-Tech and Austin Powder representatives reviewed the analysis data for the blasts in each month. Blasts in September were noted to have frequencies below or equal to 10 Hz but the PPV was very low comparatively which may be the result of small loads. Blasts in October were noticeably different. Hanson's analysis of blast data reported only one site with a frequency below or equal to 10 Hz and the PPV was low with the highest measurement still below guidelines. Even with these low readings, the quarry had very poor blast results. During the month of October each blast uncovered unexpected clay and voids creating very annoying blasts and large clouds of dust. These blasts were discussed by the Quarry Commission with Hanson and Austin Powder representatives. The current methods used by Austin Powder to keep blasting effects to a minimum are working when clay deposits and void are not unexpectedly discovered. The area with these unknowns is being cleared and is not expected to continue. Hanson personnel are continuing to review geological data attempting to insure blasting effects are kept to a minimum. Anyone interested in serving should submit short bio to the City Administrator. We thank residents for their submission of blast reports. We encourage continued submission of the Blast Report found on the City of Garden Ridge website and appreciate your attendance at the next Quarry Commission meeting December 13<sup>th</sup> at 7 P.M..

Attention Little Ones: Santa Claus is coming to town-- YOUR TOWN, Garden Ridge. He will be stopping by the Garden Ridge Library on December 18<sup>th</sup>, listening to your wish list and handing out goodies. Story Hour starts at 10:30 a.m. and Santa arrives at 11:30 a. m.

Numbers of books have been rolling into the library until the shelves are fairly bulging.

You'll find 1 new cosy mystery by Diane Mott Davidson called *The Main Corpse*.

Bob Doerr, our local Garden Ridge author, has added to his shelf 2 new books which are called *Dead Men Can Kill* and *Loose Ends Kill*.

The George W. Bush family has written 3 books which we have acquired. Former President George W. Bush most recently wrote in *Decision Points* his view of his years in office. Former First Lady Laura Bush covers much of her life in *Spoken From the Heart*. And their daughter Jenna Bush tells of her experience with a young girl in Latin America in *Ana's Story*.
